DOCTOR

So what's the problem?

PATIENT

I've been having chronic mouth pain. Discomfort, sharp aches, but over-the-counter pain medications just aren't working.

DOCTOR

I'm going to write you a prescription for Oralis.

Writes "Oralis" on notepad. Camera zooms in on words.

PATIENT

Oralis? What's that?

DOCTOR

Oralis is a different kind of oral pain medication.

DOCTOR spins in swivel chair while staring at the camera.

PATIENT

What's different about it?

DOCTOR

Oralis stops the pain in your mouth differently.

PATIENT

That doesn't really answer my-

Cut to: DOCTOR under the desk.

DOCTOR

Oralis should not be taken by women or men who are pregnant, nursing, or may be pregnant.

PATIENT

Who are you talking to?

DOCTOR

Oralis shouldn't be taken with certain other pain medications, or directly after swimming in a pool.

DOCTOR gets up and starts walking around the room with exaggerated gestures.

PATIENT

Are you still talking to me?

DOCTOR

Wait thirty minutes before taking Oralis after getting out of a pool.

PATIENT

I don't like pools.

DOCTOR

Side effects of Oralis may include minor headaches, nausea, shortness of breath, loss of breath, erections lasting for four or more hours, and mouth pain.

PATIENT

Well then what's the-

Cut to: DOCTOR unpacking and reloading papers into a briefcase.

DOCTOR

Talk to your doctor before taking Oralis, which would be me...I'm a doctor.

Soft music begins playing.

PATIENT

Is this Enya?

DOCTOR

Oralis.

DOCTOR holds up Oralis bottle.

Stops your mouth pain. Oralis.
